# Ribbed Lacy Slouch

A simple lace pattern works up quickly into a fun, soft hat with less than a skein of yarn.

## Materials

1 skein Pacific® Multis (60% Acrylic/40% Superwash Merino Wool-213 yds/100 g- shown in 514  
Size US 6 (4.0 mm) 16" circular needle  
Size US 8 (5.0 mm) 16" circular needle  
Size US 8 (5.0 mm) double point needles  
Stitch Marker  
Yarn Needle

## Abbreviations

K – Knit  
P – Purl  
K2Tog – Knit 2 Together  
P2Tog – Purl 2 Together  
YO – Yarn Over

Cast on 88 stitches with the US 6 - 16" circular needle. Join to knit in the round – be careful not to twist stitches. Place marker at the beginning of the round.

Work K2P2 (2 x 2 ribbing) for 10 rounds (approximately 1.5").  
Change to larger needles.

Begin pattern:

Row 1 - [YO, K2Tog, P2] – repeat until end of round  
Row 2 - K2, P2 – repeat until end of round  
Row 3 – [K2, YO, P2Tog] – repeat until end of round  
Row 4 – K2, P2 – repeat until end of round  
Repeat until hat measures about 10" from cast on edge

Start decreases (switch to DPNs when it is getting too tight on the circulars):

Decrease Row 1 – [YO, K2Tog, P2, K2Tog, P2] – repeat until end of round (77 stitches)  
K2, P2, K1, P2 – repeat until end of round  
Decrease Row 2 – [K2, YO, P2Tog, K1, P2Tog] – repeat until end of round (66 stitches)  
K2, P2, K1, P1 – repeat until end of round  
Decrease Row 3 – [K2Tog, P2, K1, P1] – repeat until end of round (55 stitches)  
K1, P2, K1, P1 – repeat until end of round  
Decrease Row 4 – [K1, P2Tog, K1, P1] – repeat until end of round (44 stitches)  
K1, P1 – repeat until end of round  
Decrease Row 5 – [K1, P1, K2Tog] – repeat until end of round (33 stitches)  
K1, P1, K1 – repeat until end of round  
Decrease Row 6 – [K2Tog, K1] – repeat until end of round (22 stitches)  
K – repeat until end of round  
Decrease Row 7 – [K2Tog] – repeat until end of round (11 stitches)

Cut yarn – thread through remaining 11 stitches (using tapestry needle). Weave in ends.
